Through co-creation and diverse and inclusive consultations, the Forum will bring together feminist advocates from across the globe to foster action and renew movements for gender equality, as well as to launch a set of innovative and multi-stakeholder Action Coalitions. The Generation Equality Forum will commence in Mexico City (Mexico) from 29 to 31 March 2021 and will culminate in Paris (France) in June 2021. As a global movement for urgent action and accountability for gender equality, the Forum promotes systemic and transformative change that accelerates the implementation of the historic Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action and leads to gender equality, resilience, and sustainability in a world affected by COVID-19.








With civil society at its core, the Forum in Mexico will be a moment to reinforce the power and voice of feminism, youth, and grassroots movements and to renew action towards the implementation of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action. As a critical moment for change, it will also address other urgent matters towards achieving gender equality, propelled by the COVID-19 global crisis and reinforcing the idea that gender equality must be central to every recovery plan. It will highlight the need for the Generation Equality agenda, issue a global call to action to accelerate gender equality implementation, and energize civil society and feminist movements in the drive towards securing commitments.

PROGRAMME

The Generation Equality Forum Mexico will be held virtually. The plenaries and breakout sessions will be action-oriented spaces to drive awareness around the imperative for action on gender equality, especially in a COVID-19 context. The program is designed around four critical moments:

POWER: The focus of the opening plenary will showcase the power and voice of feminism, diverse civil society, grassroots women and youth. This session will also stress the importance of public engagement and multi-stakeholder partnerships to achieving gender equality within the context of the 2030 Agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).



The Generation Equality Forum Mexico will be hosted on a virtual platform with live stream feeds through social media. Some live and in-person elements will be featured in the opening and closing ceremonies and will include a limited number of participants gathering in Mexico City following social distancing guidelines.

Women's organizations, feminist networks, youth-led organizations, community-based organizations with a strong focus on intergenerational and intersectional representation. Member States, UN entities, international organizations, private sector organizations, philanthropic entities and donor institutions and partners.









Plenary and breakout sessions will be driven by experienced feminist moderators who will direct the conversation between stakeholders and engage the audience to ensure that a diversity of views inform the interactive discussions.

Spaces for resilience and healing will be owned by civil society and youth activists.

There will be a series of 30-minute creative spaces for inspirational intergenerational and intersectional dialogues.

Breakout Sessions:

 a. Thematic dialogues focused on the Beijing Platform for Action and its critical areas of concern from a structural crisis approach.

b. Action Coalitions and the Compact on Women, Peace and Security and Humanitarian Action sessions.

These will be offered at two different times, accommodating audiences based in both Western and Eastern Hemispheres.

Networking spaces will be provided to the UN system, civil society, youth, philanthropies and other key partners to showcase their work on gender equality, including in the context of the COVID-19 response and recovery.

The virtual space is designed to allow for vibrant and active interaction. Participants will have the ability to interact in Q&A segments, Chat, answering polling questions, join networking opportunities and access supplemental resources.









Registration will open to all participants from 17 February to 19 March 2021.

Member States are invited to participate with representation at the Ministerial Level.

The Generation Equality Forum's Civil Society Advisory Group (CSAG) and Youth Task Force will mobilize the participation of civil society from around the world.

In the registration form, participants will identify the thematic areas of interest to them. Opportunities to participate will be allocated depending on the capacity of the rooms. The principles of balanced intersectional and intergenerational engagement will be observed.

In the breakout sessions, attendees will contribute to the discussions via a moderated chat, and the contributions will be reflected in the readout of the respective session.
